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INTRODUCTION:

Under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded an additional \$59,677 in CDBG funding to the Town of Paradise. This funding is referred to Community Development Block Grant – Recovery (CDBG-R). The CDBG-R award is to be recorded as a substantial amendment to the Town's 2008 CDBG Action Plan. The Action Plan outlines specific projects and activities that the Town will carry out during the year. This amendment to the 2008 Action Plan outlines how the Town will spend the additional funding that it received under the ARRA.

- (1) Activity Name: Almond Street Overlay and pedestrian improvements in conjunction with the Pearson Road Park-and-Ride Facility.

Funding Amount: \$53,709

- a. Activity Description: The project includes the overlay of Almond Street and pedestrian improvements from Pearson Road to Foster Road. This is part of a transportation-related infrastructure project in a HUD established low-mod income area. It is also in the downtown "Central Business" zone, which would promote economic development by providing much needed parking in the downtown area. A portion of the project is currently funded by a federal CMAQ (Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program) grant and therefore is already subject to federal-aid transportation project requirements and provisions. Adding the CDBG-R funding would allow the addition of Almond overlay and pedestrian ADA improvements from Pearson Road to Foster Road. Sidewalks are an essential element to our downtown master streetscape plan, as creating a walk-able downtown will make it easier for shoppers to park their vehicles and walk to shops and restaurants in the area.
- b. Jobs Created: The Pearson Road park-and-ride construction project and the related Almond Street/pedestrian improvement project will create several temporary construction jobs. No new permanent jobs will be created as a direct result of this project; however, increased parking capacity could increase economic activity in the downtown area, creating positive economic benefits and increased employment opportunities for Paradise.
- c. Additional Activity Information: The completed park-and-ride facility and pedestrian improvements will mitigate pollution by providing a facility where carpools can meet and catch rides, or catch the bus which is stationed down the block. The facility also allows for a more "walkable" downtown.
