





Update & Affirmation of Direction

Previous Council Action

- March 2024, Approved the applications and implementation of three CDBG-DR MIT-RIP Projects
 - ♦ Private Road Identification Safety Project \$1M
 - ♦ Evacuation Route Changeable Message Sign Project \$5.4M
 - ♦ Storm Drain Resiliency Project (Phase 1) \$3.9M







Current Status

- ♦ Private Road Identification Safety Project \$1M
 - ♦ Environmental/Design underway by in-house staff
- ♦ Evacuation Route Changeable Message Sign Project \$5.4M
 - ♦ Prepared to start Environmental/Design by consultant team
- ♦ Storm Drain Resiliency Project (Phase 1) \$3.9M
 - ♦ Environmental/Design underway by consultant staff

Council Initiated Item Request

- ♦ Discuss the CDBG-MIT-RIP allocation for Evacuation Route Permanent Changeable Message Sign Project. (CULLETON)
 - ♦ Q: Can the signs be used for other public messages during non-emergency hours?
 - ♦ A: Yes, limited to public safety messages (ie community messaging campaigns such as One Less Spark for wildfire risk, special weather events, community traffic impacts, etc)
 - ♦ Q: If the Council decides to abandon the project altogether, can the funds be reallocated somewhere else (ie more storm drain projects)?
 - ♦ A: Probably. Assuming it would be limited to the existing approved CDBG-DR MIT RIP Project budget augmentation (ie a Storm Drain Resiliency Project Phase 3).

Relevant News and Next Steps

♦ In late November, staff learned that \$8.6M in additional CDBG-DR MIT-RIP funds would be allocated to the Town for the Storm Drain Resiliency Project Phase 2.

♦ ACTION REQUEST:

 Provide direction to continue the Evacuation Route Signs Project OR formally explore next steps to reallocate funds to additional storm drain projects
